HIPAA Tip Sheet- Personal Identifiers

Health information is considered PHI under HIPAA if an identifier is included in the same record set. An identifier ties the information to an individual. If the information includes any of the 18 identifiers, it should be protected against unauthorized disclosure.

18 HIPAA Identifiers

The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) lists the 18 HIPAA identifiers as follows:



1. Patient names
2. Geographical elements (such as a street address, city, county, or zip code)
3. Dates related to the health or identity of individuals (including birthdates, date of admission, date of discharge, date of death, or exact age of a patient older than 89)
4. Telephone numbers
5. Fax numbers
6. Email addresses
7. Social security numbers
8. Medical record numbers
9. Health insurance beneficiary numbers
10. Account numbers
11. Certificate/license numbers
12. Vehicle identifiers
13. Device attributes or serial numbers
14. Digital identifiers, such as website URLs
15. IP addresses
16. Biometric elements, including finger, retinal, and voiceprints
17. Full face photographic images
18. Other identifying numbers or codes

For example, a list of patient's name and their diagnosis is considered PHI but a listing of the most frequent diagnosis treated by VNS Health would not be considered PHI if no identifiers were included.
